

How Do I Know I Will Get Materials That I Enjoy?

Before sending materials to your home a member of the library staff will call to schedule a home visit. At our first meeting we will discuss areas of interest which will help us better understand what types of authors, and books you prefer or any other information that may be helpful.

Call anytime with requests for specific authors or titles.

How Long May I Borrow The Items I Take Out?

The lending period for all items through the Homebound program is 6 weeks. You can renew your materials once as long as no other patrons are waiting for them

What is the cost for the service?

The service is free to qualified St. Clair County residents. Materials are sent in mailbags, just flip the pre-stamped mail card so our address shows and mail it back. We'll send out your next batch of books the same day we receive your returned mailbag.

Do I Need To Be A St. Clair County Resident to Receive Homebound Services?

Yes. Due to limited resources, we cannot offer our services to non-resident cardholders, or to members of other libraries who participate in the Michcard program.
